Applications are open to all landowners: farmers, smallholders, councils, community groups, schools, colleges, sports clubs, golf clubs, youth groups, healthcare and hospital grounds, church and faith communities, gardeners and other landowners

Applications are accepted on a first come first served basis. Trees on the Land have limited numbers of trees and applications will be closed early if all trees are accounted for before the deadline.

Application Deadline: Applications for trees will close at 5pm on Monday 14th October 2024.

#### €1 million in funding announced for the IRFU and the FAI under the Healthy Ireland Walking Tracks initiative.




The funds will be used to make community walking tracks located on sports clubs' grounds more accessible to more people.

The initiative supports the upgrade of existing walking track facilities to make them more accessible to people with mobility issues, such as older people and wheelchair users. Funding may also cover upgrading or the installation of lighting designed to prolong the hours of usage particularly during the dark winter evenings. Grants will be awarded to clubs in each organisation following a competitive application process.

Both the IRFU and the FAI will issue a call for applications through their respective organisations this week with successful clubs being notified by late September.

review arises from recent legislation (Road Traffic Act 2024) which provides for the phased lowering of default speed limits in Ireland. The phased lowering will include: - Phase 1 - Reduction in Rural Local Road Speed Limit to 60km/h - Phase 2 - Reduction in Urban and National Road Speed Limits


The commencement date of the of the 60km/h default speed limit for Rural Local Roads is at the end of November
