





Through the workshops, participants will gain a clear understanding of the diversity of lived experiences, and in so doing promote respect and inclusivity. Participants will develop a range of practical skills on how to stay safe, keep their friends safe, and how to make a helpful, safe and effective intervention when they witness problematic behaviour.
